The seating area work on Seaside Road would be carried out by Easington Beach Caravan Park. The 71 bus service is funded by ERYC and Cllr Tucker confirmed that a Public Service Survey would be carried out shortly to assess the needs of the area, regarding public transport.

It had been proposed that Kilnsea would trial 2 buses per week for 4 months from the village to Withernsea and then review.

Cllr Tucker was pleased to announce that ERDF had awarded a grant to help to fund the rock armour provision for the area of great erosion near the road between Hollym and Withernsea. This is great news. The scheme will cover an area of 400m and it is forecasted that this will protect the area for 100 years. Work will comment w/c 4th June, 2019.

- Parish Council Newsletter: Cllr Livas-Dawes presented costings for the printing of newsletters for other parishes.
- Dog Fouling in the Parish – Cllr Longhorn has some stencils and the clerk will provide marking paint so this work could be carried out.
- Overhanging trees, Coastguard Cottages – Cllr Longhorn – it had been reported that lorries had been striking the trees and dislodging loose branches. Cllr Longhorn said any work on the trees could not be done with the equipment he uses.
