<p>1. Co-option discussion – One vacancy was filled by co-option, Tony Smith was successful.</p>	
<p>2. Minutes of the meeting on Monday 3rd June, 2019 were approved and signed by the Chair.</p>	
<p>3. Finalisation of Councilors roles and responsibilities – It was agreed to move this item to the next meeting.</p>	
<p>4. Clerks Update The disused boat compound Seaside Road – Has spoken with Jeremy Pickle’s office regarding the area and also reported the items left to ERYC to see if they can arrange for them to be cleared. The large tyres have now been pushed onto the beach, hence reported this as very dangerous. COG update – Jackson Sage have responded but no luck with any funding despite the Clerk’s best efforts. Paul Clarke has sent a letter of thanks for the help provided by the PC.</p>	
<p>5. Community Police support Introduction to Lucy Masters who will take on the role as community liaison within the villages. She will be holding surgeries in order that people can talk to her about issues / concerns and receive relevant advice.</p>	
<p>6. Public Forum Andrea Clubley: stated the tyres from the disused boat compound had been pushed onto the beach and have been stacked up. Mike Welton: The cemetery gate is in need of some attention out as it is sticking. Streetscene to look at this. Jackie: Dog fouling in Easington – Despite signs this is still happening – The Clerk asked for anyone with information on days/times, it could be reported and the Dog Warden would attend and issue fines to anyone not clearing up after their dog. The Parish Council would look into more bins being provided.</p>	<p>AMW DL AMW</p>

Ward Councillor Update – Cllr Tucker</p> <p>The directional sign to the Youth Club would be £50 and this information would be passed to the YC committee.</p> <p>The Woodland Trust have confirmed that the next named woodland would be call Harris Wood, a fitting tribute to the late Cllr Dr Livas-Dawes.</p> <p>The street furniture for Seaside Road would be in situ within 10 days and following this the area would be cut back and planted. This work is being carried out by Easington Beach Caravan Site.</p> <p>Following the meeting with the IDB it is felt that the pumping station needs to be upgraded and relocated as part of the re-alignment scheme.</p> <p>Suggestion about creating wild flower areas within the Parish using some of the grass verges. Parish Councillors were in favour of this.</p>
