1. Minutes of the meeting on Monday 7th October & 2nd September, 2019 were agreed as a true record.	
2. Clerks Update The disused boat compound Seaside Road. DT is now dealing with this. COG update – No change or update. StreetScene report – No updates of work from Councillors. Life preserver at Kilnsea is now located on the toilet within Blue Bell carpark Easington Public phone box . Notice has been placed in the box at Kilnsea but no notification received. The Kilnsea box was to be repaired but an application to remove the phone from Easington has been lodged with ERYC. This box had been used 10 times in the last 12 months. Councillors voted to adopt the box following further information about rates being provided. Good Councillor training sessions – Cllr(s) Nicholson & A Tucker are wishing to attend future training sessions. Tithe Barn – I have Contacted the architect via email but have received no response. Ownership of the corner at Kilnsea . ERYC have confirmed that this land is part of the highway, as per the map shown. DT advised that Terry Weaver of ERYC should have been out to look as the bollards.	AMW
3. Public Forum MW: 17 Headstones have been straightened up. Thanks were given. Lucy: MOD update. Following a meeting with Gassco an expression of greater community involvement was made. They would be fully supportive of speed awareness events in the villages, also a representative would like to attend a coffee morning. Cllr Smith asked about the lack of attendance by the MOD police at a recent incident at The White Horse Public House. Lucy said that officers were on route but were stood down by Humberside Police. She also said that any calls for police assistance must be made to Humberside Police as the initial call during the incident was made directly to the MOD police which could result in delays to a police presence.	
4. Ward Councillor Update – Councillor Tucker The rock armour work: Crown licence and MMO approval is needed and should be received within 4 weeks. There has been a further large amount of cliff lost recently. Post box at Kilnsea: Investigation into the removal is ongoing.

Cllr Tucker will chase with Terry Weaver of ERYC</p> <p>Bund at Blue Bell carpark: planning approval has not been given for this and Alan Menzies has contacted YWT with instructions to remove it.</p> <p>Community Speed Watch: Three speed checks have taken place and during the first 24 out of 100 vehicles were speeding, during the second 18 and the third 4. This is very positive. PC Goodwin of Humberside Police would like Easington to run with a trial for members of the community to carry out speed checks. After discussion Cllrs voted in principle to support a trial.</p>
