<p>4. Ward Councillor Update – Councillor Tucker The beach at Withernsea is closed to bathers until 26th September due to an outfall water pipe. The issue with the water will effect Easington and Kilnsea but these are not designated bathing beaches and the risk is minimal. Ward Councillor thanks have been sent to Ronny as he leaves Gassgo. Thanks and appreciation for his support to the community has also been sent from the PC. Speed survey will be resuming shortly in our Parish. Cllr D Tucker advised the footpath along Seaside Road (Blackwell Pond to The Tower) had now been resurfaced, Cllr Graham said the work had not been carried out. DT said yellow markings were in place throughout the village so work would be commencing shortly on footpaths in the area. Complaints regarding Easington Autos have been passed to the relevant body, specifically illegal living.</p>
